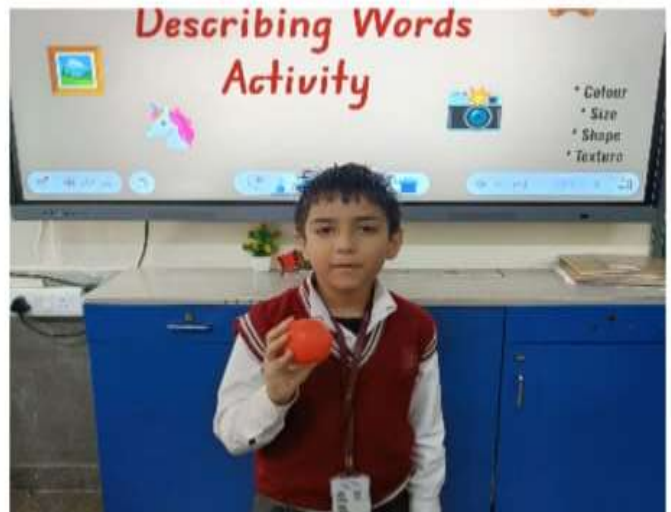




## Describing Words-Speaking Activity

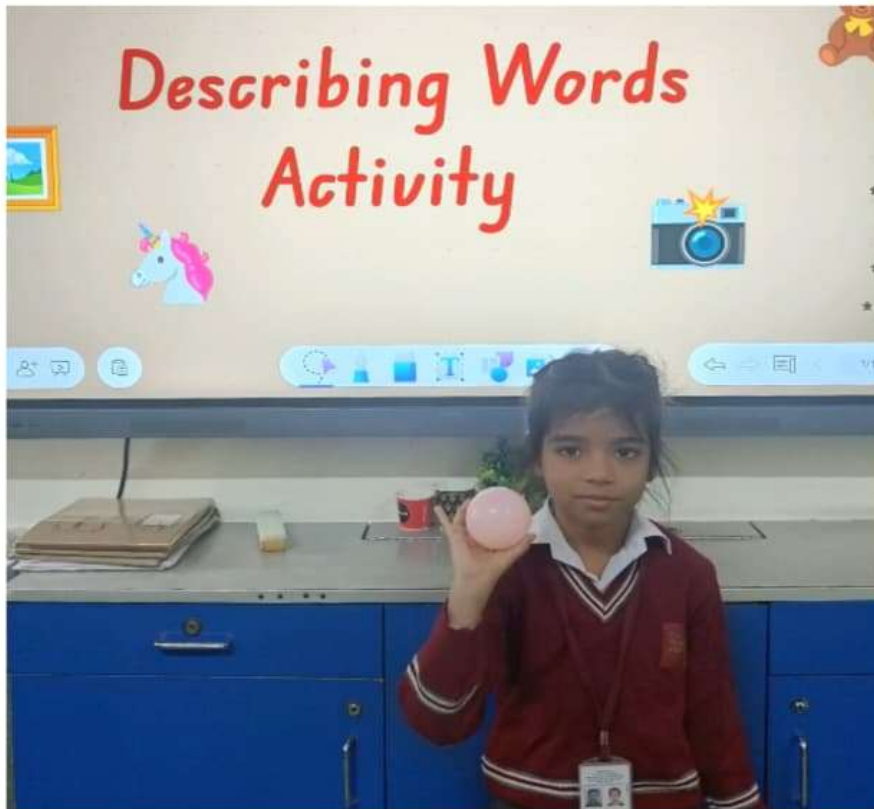

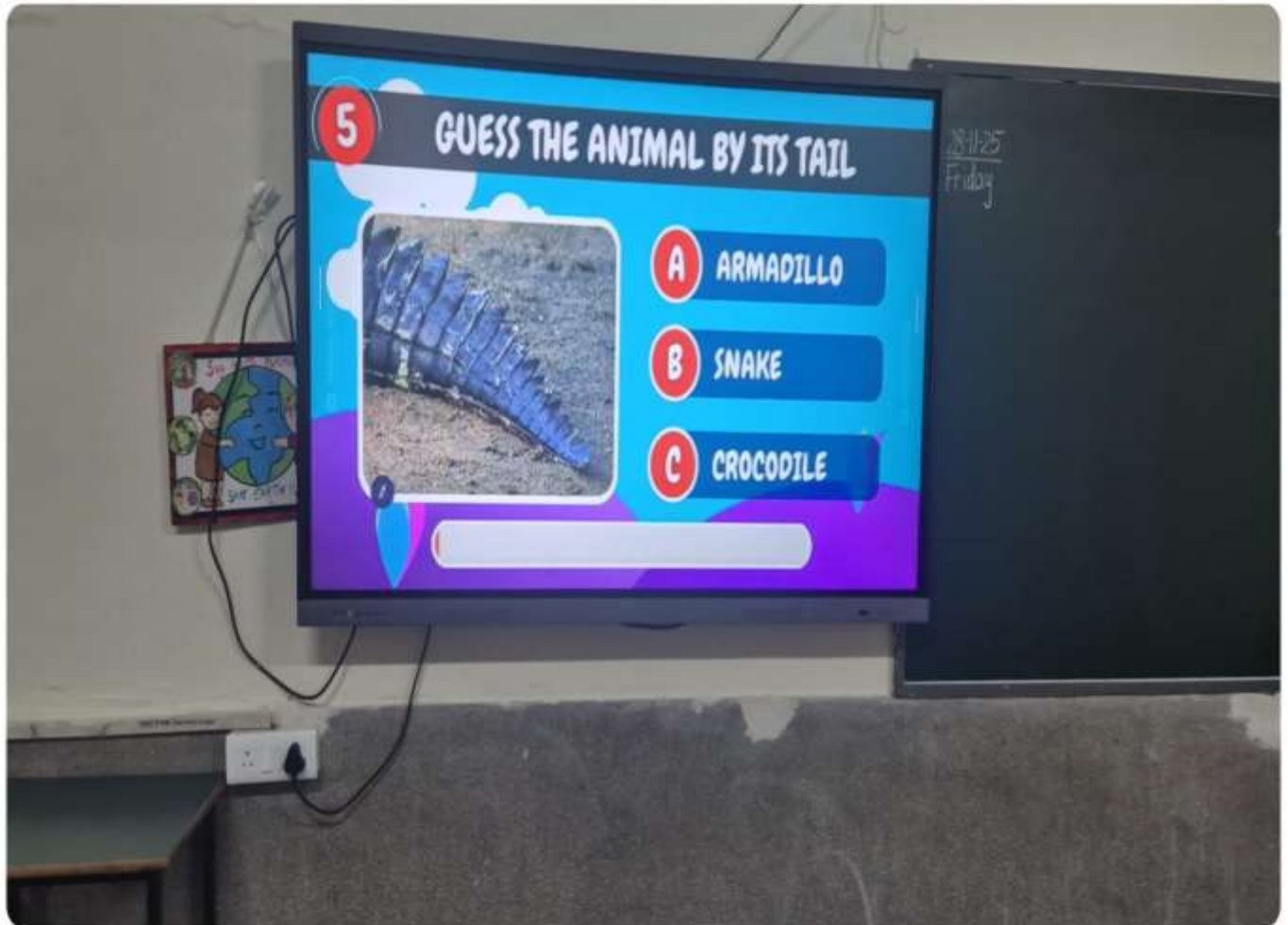


## Tails of Animals

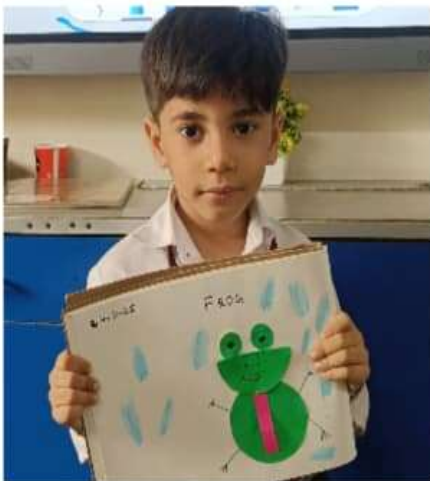
### Paper Frog Craft Activity

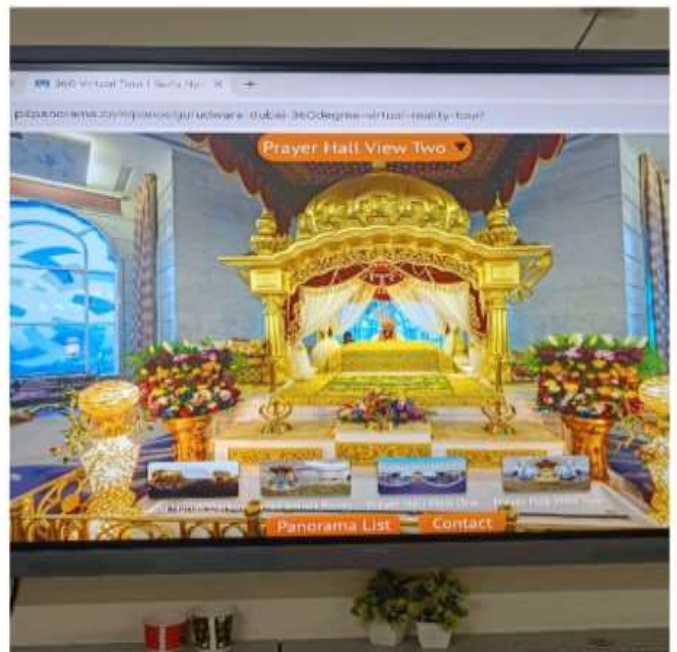


## Virtual Gurudwara Tour: Gurupurab Activity

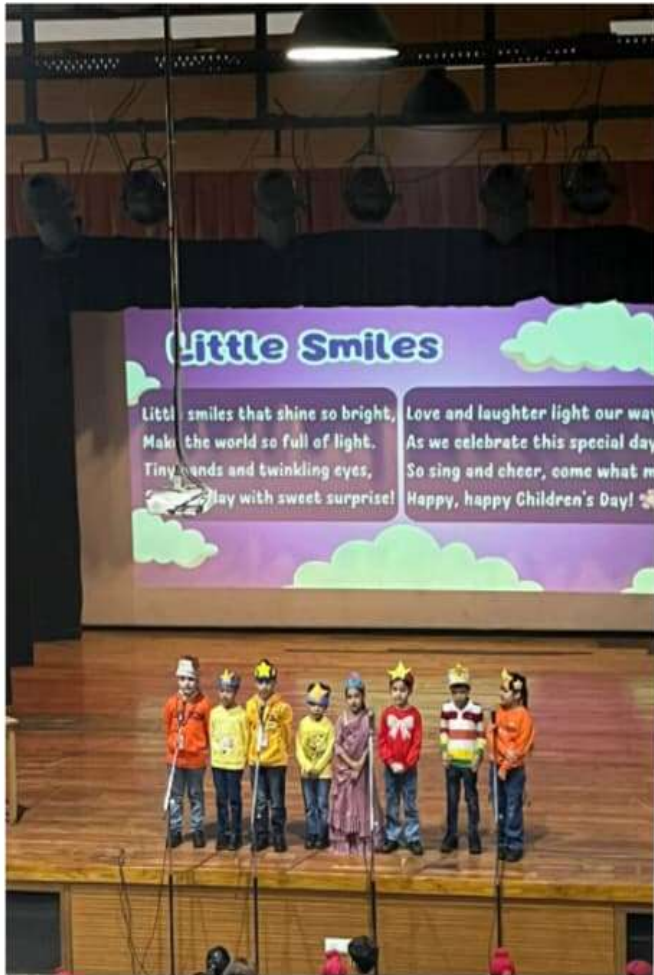
The assembly provided a platform for students to build confidence, expression, and public speaking skills, making the celebration enjoyable and memorable for all.

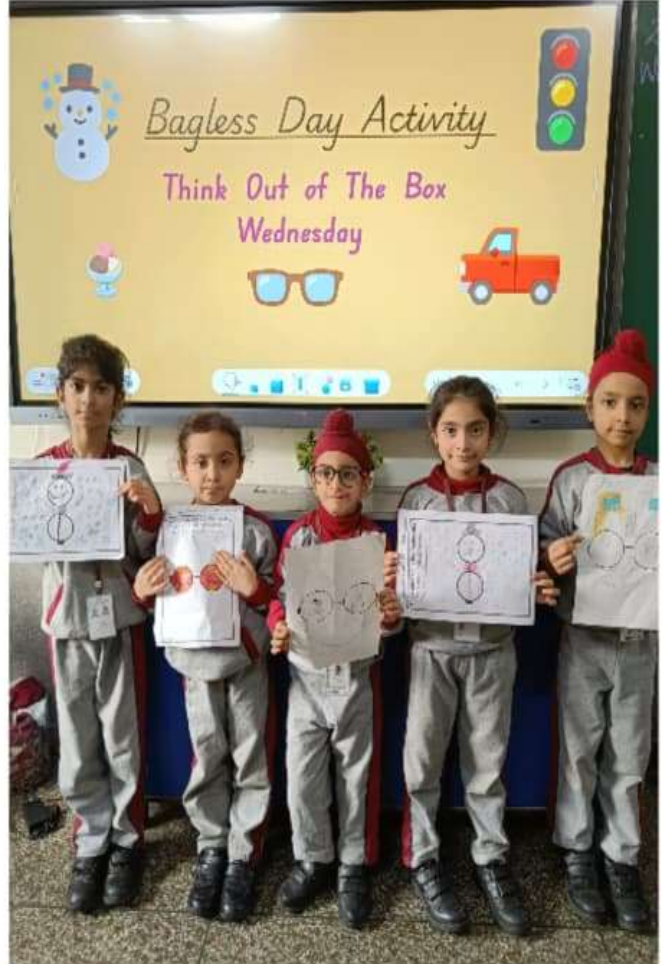
### **Out of the Box Activity**

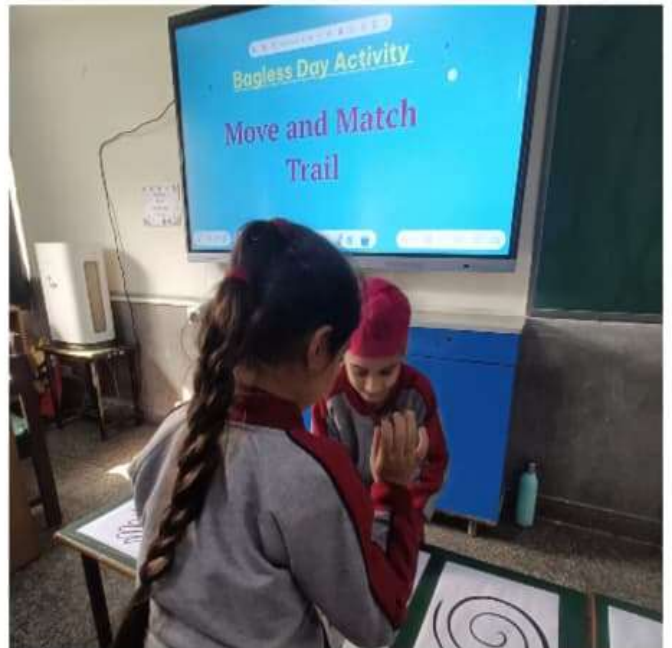
### Move and Match Trail

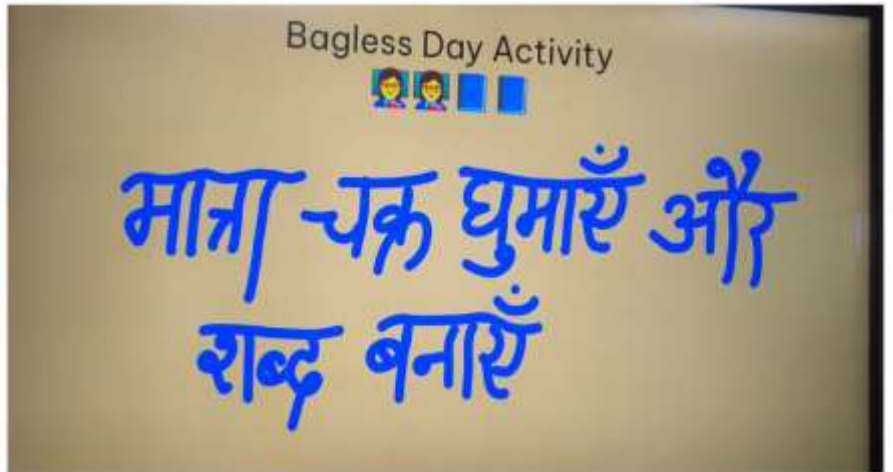


## मात्रा चक्र घुमाएँ और शब्द बनाए

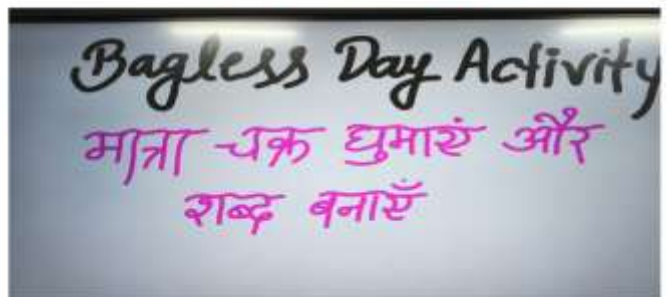

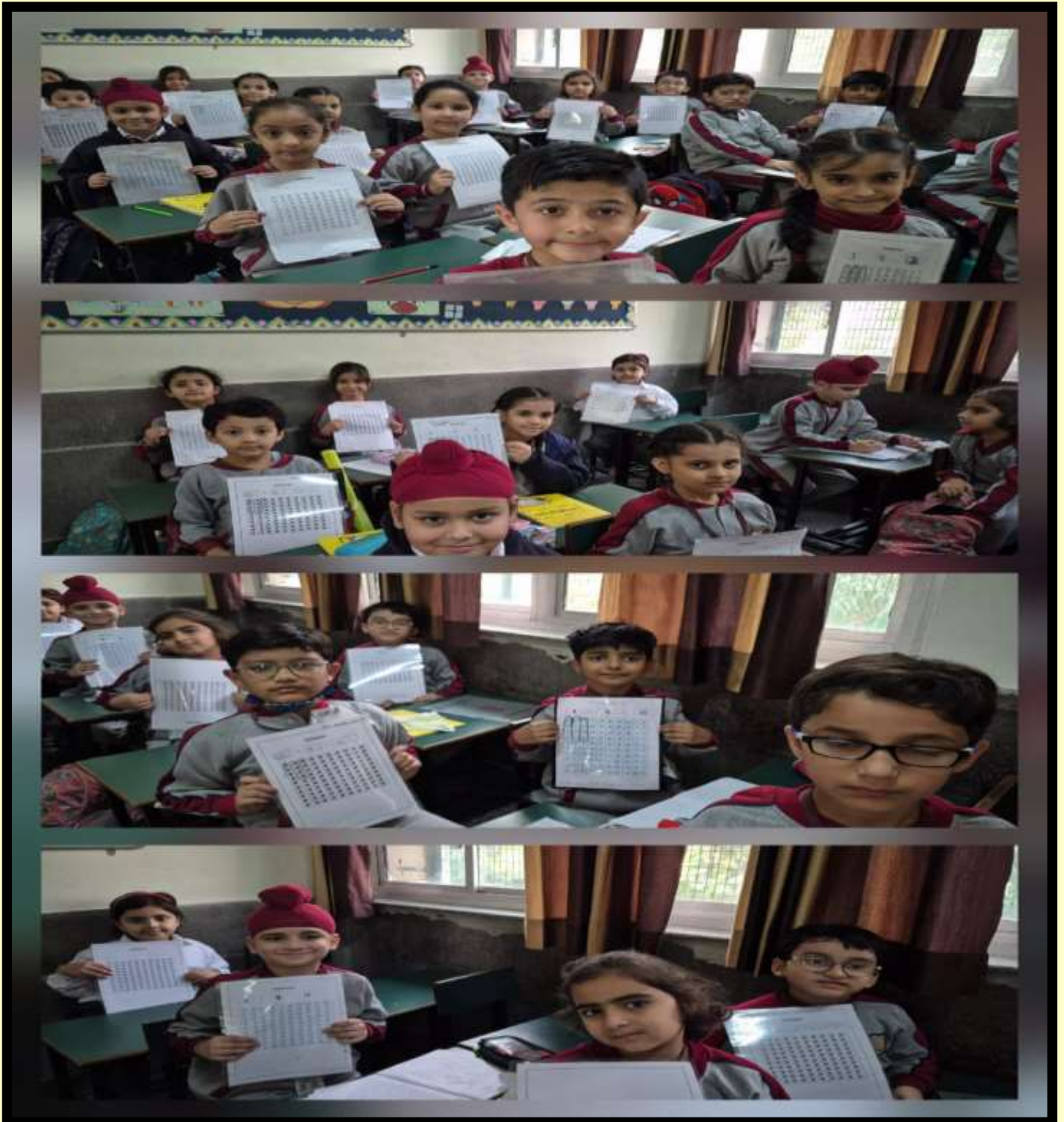




## Bagless days

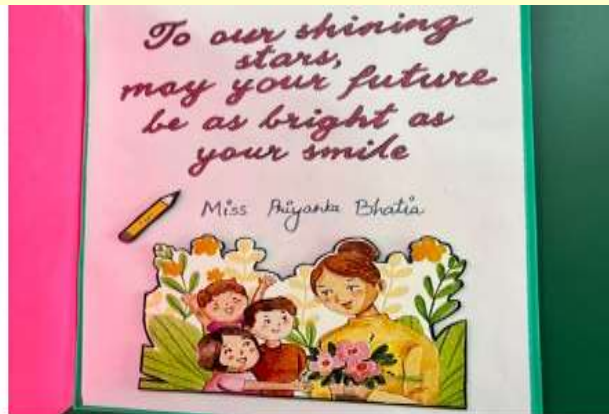


### Shilpkar Craft Workshop & Class Celebration

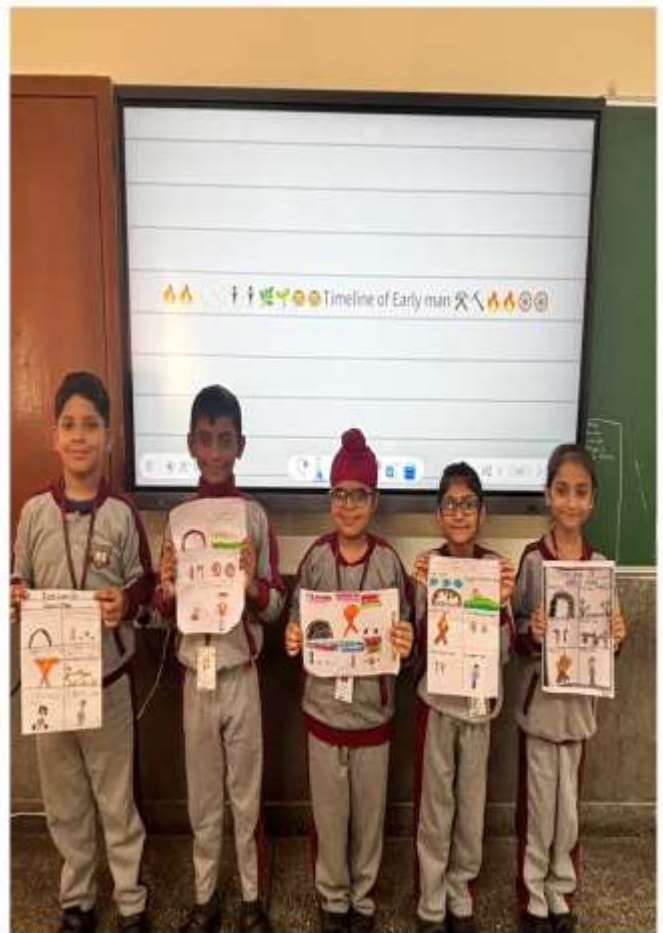




# Timeline of Early man

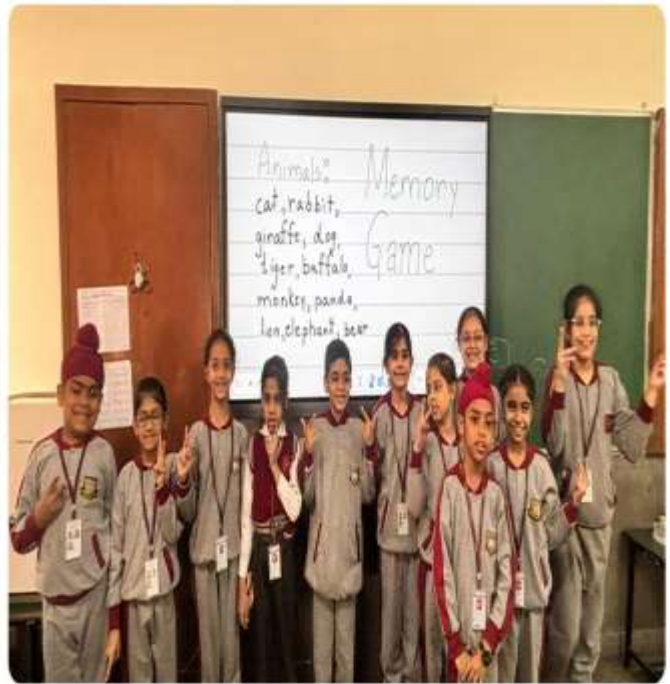




## Memory Game

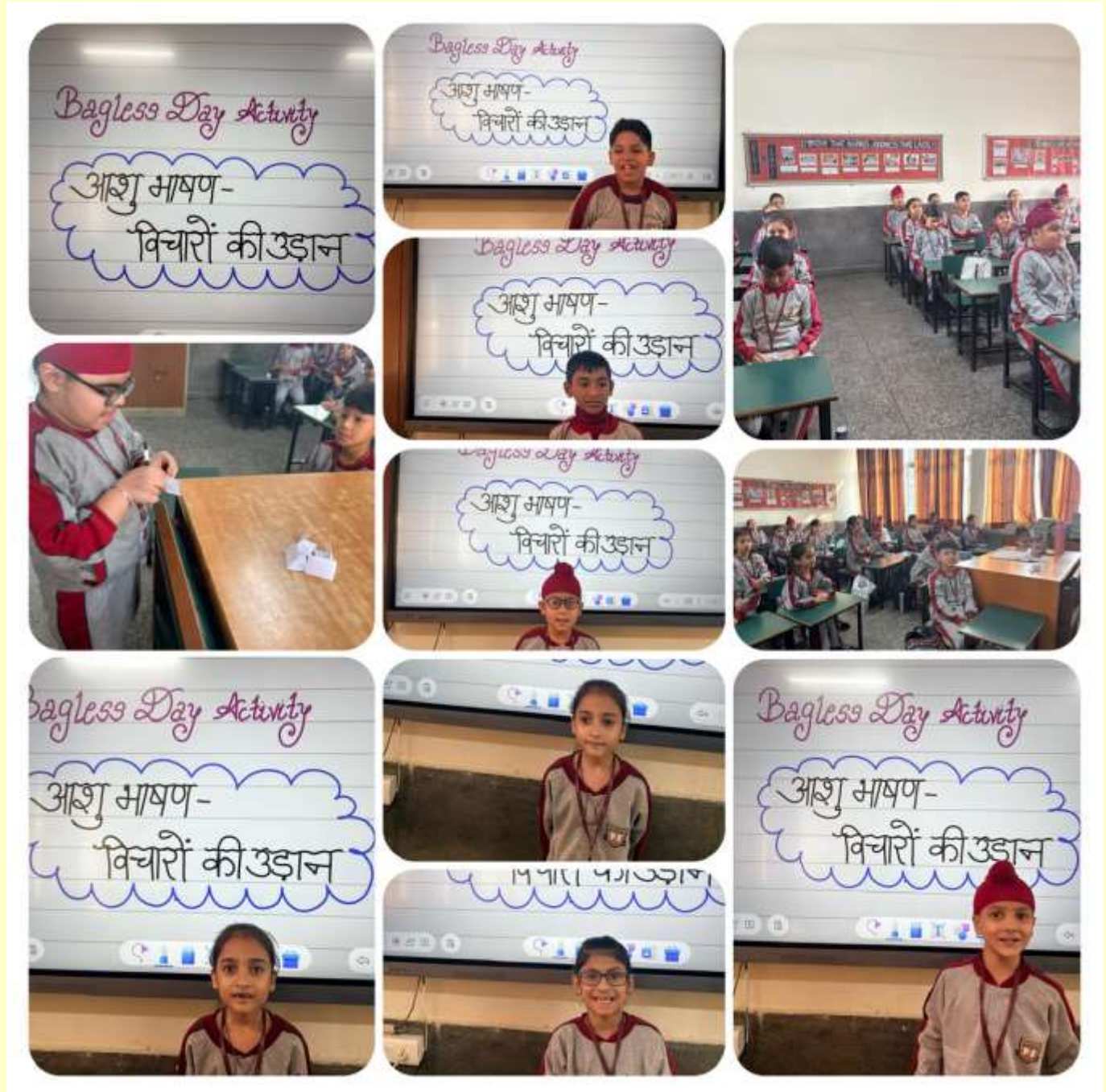




### विचारों को दो उड़ान — आशु भाषण गतिविधि के साथ!

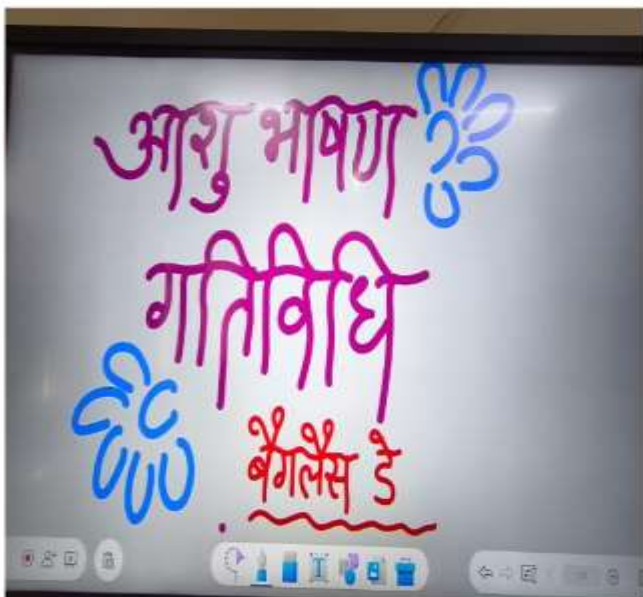
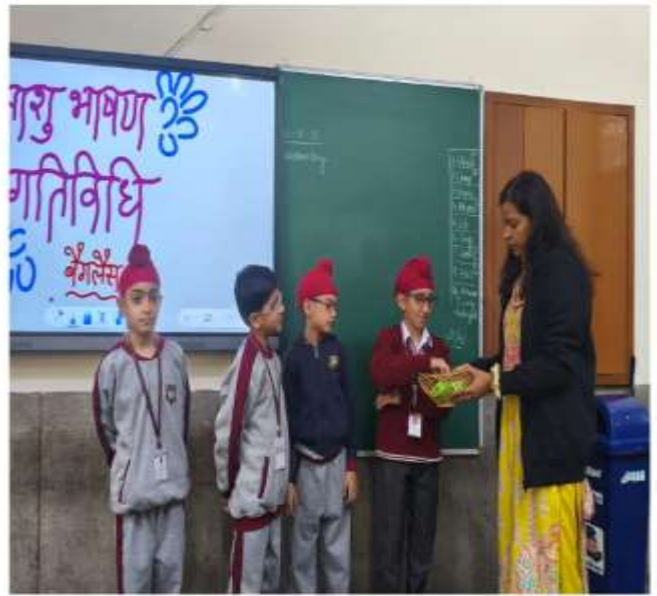


















## Bagless day Activities

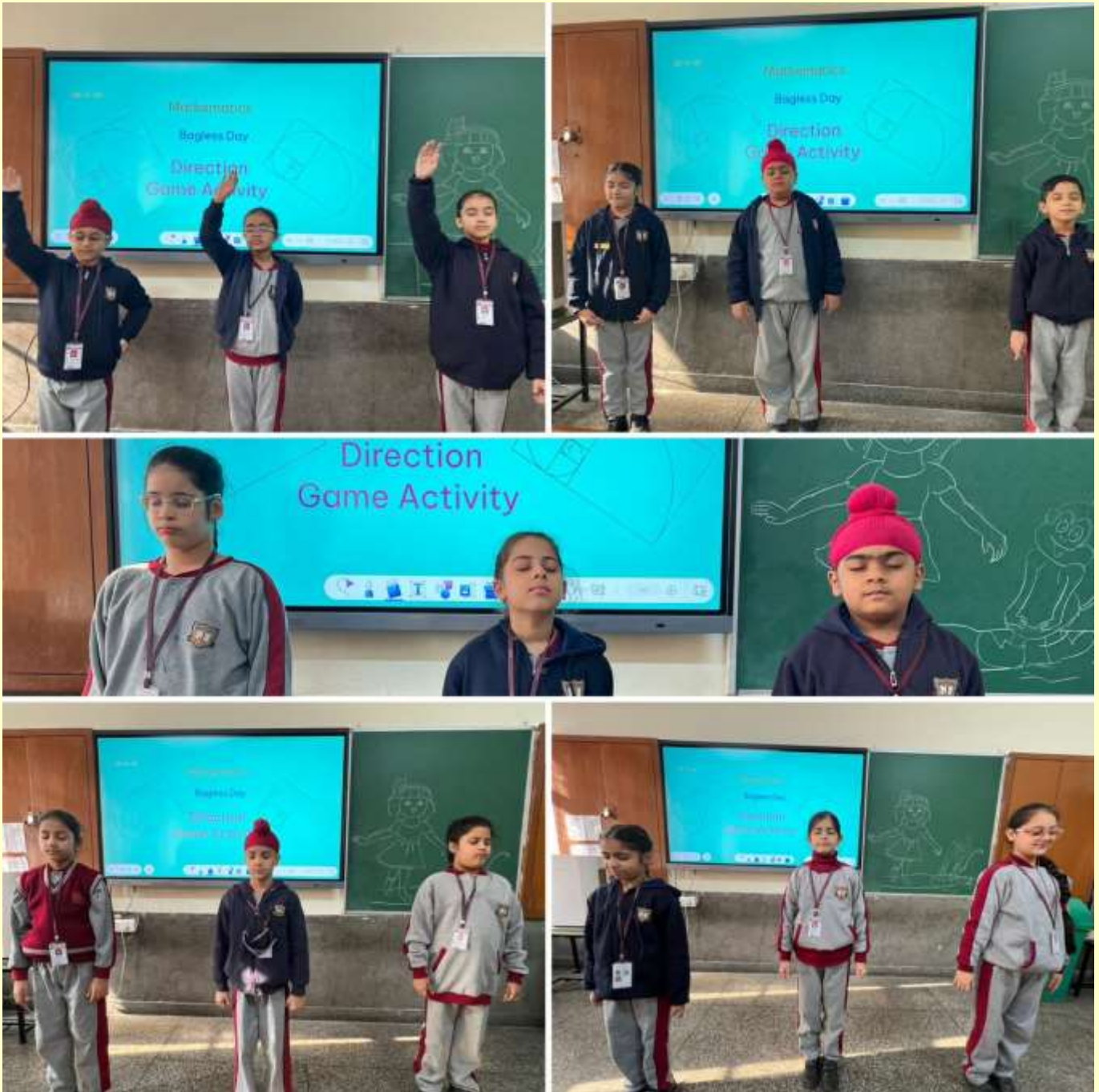


### Direction Game

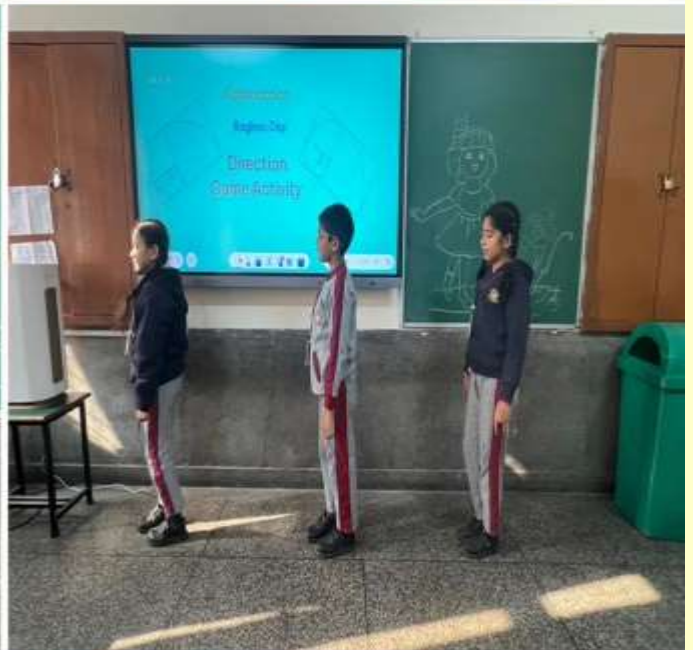

The activity made the concept enjoyable and helped students build confidence in understanding movement and navigation skills.

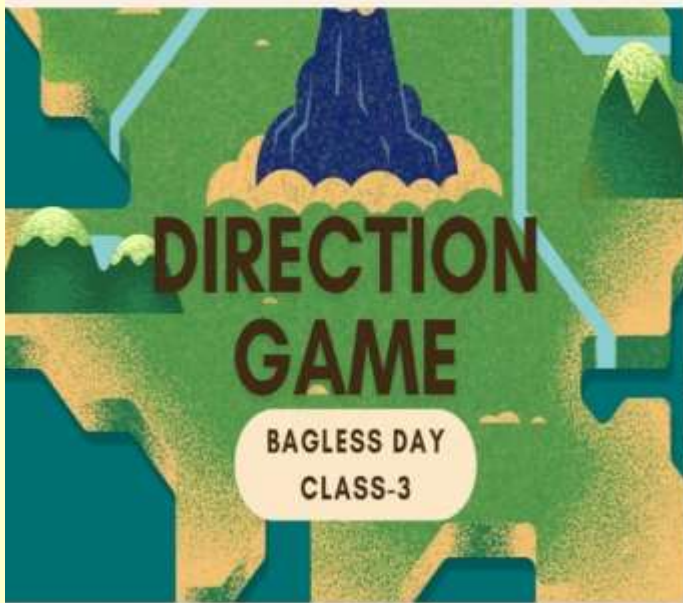

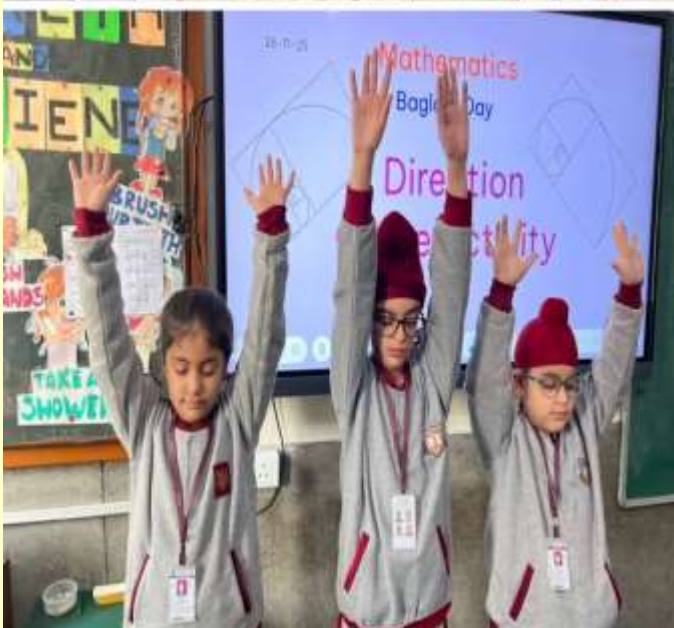
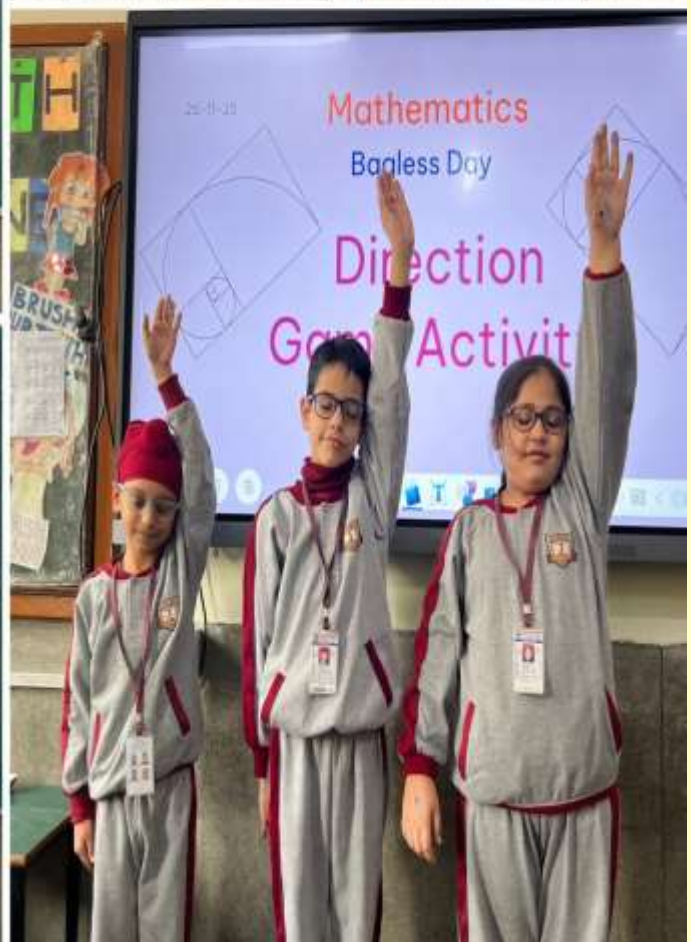




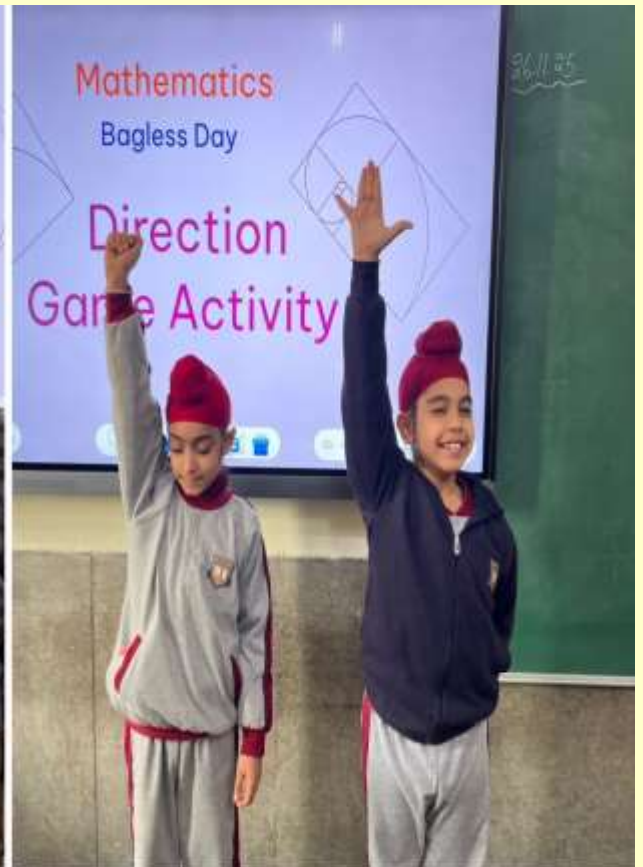




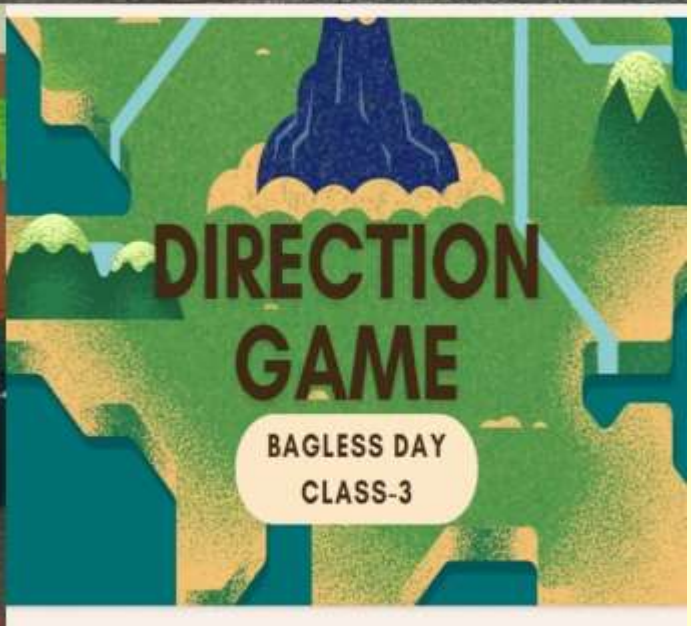














### “सोचो और रचो” गतिविधि
