
I, Nidhi Chanana (Art Teacher of JKPS) was assigned to undertake an art activity which was interesting and enriching for the students of classes 4 and 5. Moreover, it had to be a collaborative programme with an overseas partner school. I was able to contact Mrs. Nidhi Jain (art teacher of Bhartiya Vidya Bhavan School, Kuwait) who very graciously discussed and agreed for the same. We finalized to exchange Indian art form of 'Worli/ Warli Painting' and the Traditional 'Islamic Geometric Design' art form of Kuwait.

The idea was to let the students of classes 4 and 5 reach out to each other through art and culture. Both the art techniques are very different and at the same time, they touch our emotions and feelings.


Warli Painting is a style of tribal art mostly created by the tribal people from the North Sahyadri Range in India. The tribal art originated in Maharashtra where it is still practiced. Whereas, geometrical designs in Islamic Art are often built on the combination of repeated squares and circles, which may be overlapped and interlaced to form intricate and complex patterns, including a wide variety of tessellations.



These wall paintings use a set of basic geometric shapes: a circle, a triangle, and a square. These shapes are symbolic of different elements of nature.

- The circle represents the sun and the moon.
- The square appears to be a human invention, indicating a sacred enclosure or a piece of land
- The triangle is derived from mountains and pointed trees.
