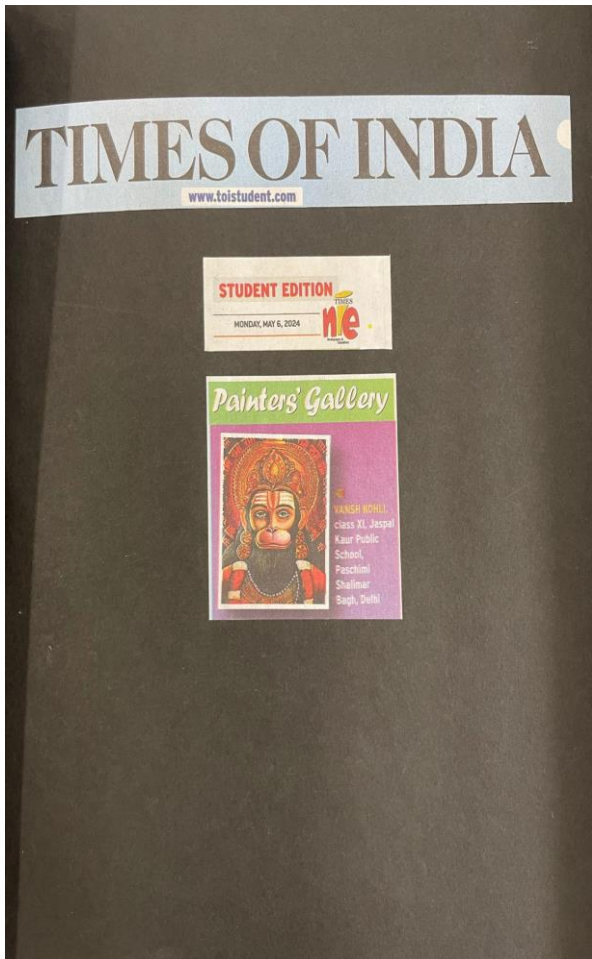
which Shovana Narayan illustrated as a fusion of devotion and artistic expression.

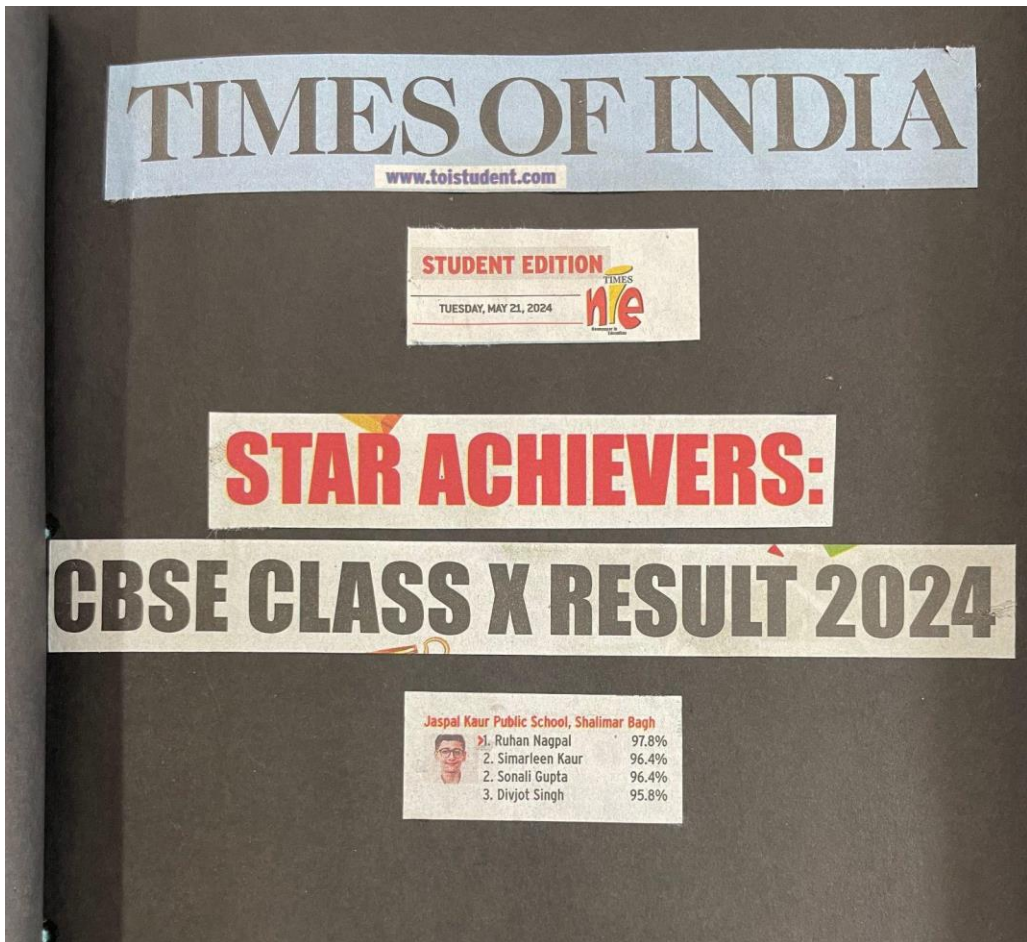

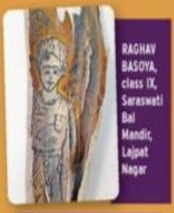
