


The session ended with a live worksheet and the students were very excited to give answers. Not only this they had the perfect score which motivated them.

Our young learners were also praised and applauded for their excellent performance which made them extremely happy and they felt motivated to learn even more in upcoming sessions.




Our teachers are also taking <u>one-on-one doubts sessions</u> on the Zoom platform. This step has been taken to make students **academically strong and confident.**
